As you go deeper, remember that people who write about polyamory do not all agree with each other, and they frequently assign sweeping moral and ethical judgments to their differences. It is best to accept that there is no such thing as "the polyamorous community." After all, there is no such thing as the "monogamous community" – there are complementarians, egalitarians, people who insist all sex must occur within marriage, people who insist marriage is an irredeemably oppressive patriarchal institution, people who condemn divorce, people who are champions of no-fault divorce, etc.
